


Apply for \$2,500 Scholarship

Recipe of the Month:

Potato Cakes



INGREDIENTS:

- · 4 large potatoes
- · 1 yellow onion
- · 1 egg, beaten
- · I teaspoon salt
- · Ground black pepper to taste
- · 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour, or more as needed
- · I cup vegetable oil for frying, or as needed

DIRECTIONS:

Step I - Finely grate potatoes and onion into a large bowl. Drain off any excess liquid.

Step 2 - Mix in egg, salt, and pepper. Add enough flour to make the mixture thick, about 2 to 4 tablespoons all together.

Step 3- Preheat the oven to low, about 200 degrees F (95 degrees C).

Step 4- Heat I/4 inch oil in the bottom of a heavy skillet over medium-high heat. Drop two or three I/4-cup mounds of batter into hot oil, and flatten with back of a spatula to make I/2-inch-thick pancakes. Fry, turning pancakes once, until golden brown.

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} \bf Step 5 - Transfer pancakes to a plate lined with a paper towel to drain. Keep warm in the oven until serving. Repeat until all potato mixture is used. \\ \end{tabular}$
